- Awarded the Member of the New Zealand Order of Merit in the Queen's New Year Honours list 2011.
- 2017 World Finals will be in Toronto, Canada





Introduction: Kids' Lit Quiz TM

- An international literature competition for participants aged **10 to 13 years**
- In teams of **4**, contestants answer 100 questions from classics to comics to contemporary novels.
- 10 categories: Poetry, authors, titles, book villains (vary each year!)
- Competition takes place in Australia, Canada, Hong Kong, New Zealand, Singapore, South Africa, United Kingdom and USA

Girls win big at literature quiz

It was now or never for four girls from Methodist Girls' School (Secondary).

In a tense, fast-paced competition, they saw them prevail over 82 other teams. Liisa Chua, Elizabeth Chua, Han Xuan Ying, and Lin Chuan, all 13, came from the bottom half of the groups to emerge top dog at the POSB-NLB Kids' Lit Quiz.

The four Secondary 1 girls won the ultimate prize – a chance to represent Singapore at the Kids' Lit Quiz World Finals, to be held in the United Kingdom, on the world stage.

In its third year in Singapore, the local annual literature competition is for youngsters aged 10 to 15, and is organised by the National Library Board (NLB), and supported by POSB. It pits their knowledge of children's books in genres from classic works to graphic novels, and everything in between.

Elizabeth said: "This is our last year. If we didn't get it, we wouldn't be able to try again because of the age limit of the competition."

At the national finals held on April 23 at the CBS Auditorium, the top 10 teams were put to the test in a nail-biting 36,222 round – where they had to answer 75 questions in five different categories –

as founder of the international competition, Mr Wayne M's, played out loud.

It was a balance between being cautious and learning to take risks, since speed was as important as accuracy," said Erin.

Ninety teams from 51 schools (30 primary and 21 secondary schools) signed up for the competition this year. After three gruelling rounds – the heats held on April 18 and 19, the semi-finals on April 21, and the national finals on April 23 – the MGS team was crowned champion, while teams from Nanyang Primary School and Clement Primary School came in second and third respectively.

ENCOURAGES READING

The competition aims to be a novel way to encourage children to read – and it seems to have succeeded. If the girls' experiences were anything to go by.

For instance, Erin found that reading helped her to better communicate with her peers.

She said: "Sometimes I don't know how to put my views and thoughts in a way that the other person understands. Reading helps me to speak more eloquently and allows me to process how other people work."

Her teammate, Elizabeth, on the other hand, found strength in the strong team ties in music.

Speaking to Little Red Dot, she cited A Little Princess by Frances Hodgson Burnett as her favourite book. The independent protagonist Sara Crewe – who in the book suffered hardships of all sorts before regaining her rightful status as the daughter of a wealthy English widower – taught her that, unlike in many "come-and-see-fairy-tales", women did not need men to overcome their woes.

In the lead-up to the competition, the NLB organised a Library Beat Camp in March for participants to exchange their thoughts on their favourite books.

A junior at Tanjong Pagar Secondary Primary School, who she met at the camp, even wrote her a list of books to read.

The four winners will be flown to Auckland, New Zealand, in an eight-day all-expenses-paid trip, where they will meet winners from countries such as the United States, South Africa and Australia in the upcoming finals on Aug 19.

Elizabeth said: "Winning was an amazing feeling. We had so much as possible to prepare for the quiz, and now that it was paid off, we are excited to represent Singapore."

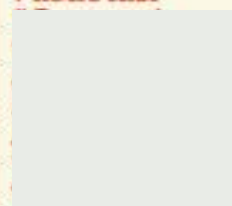

SURVIVAL TIP 6

Knowing the Rules!

REGISTRATION

- All participants must be between **10 and 13 years** as at 1 July 2017.
 - In the event that a participant is found not to meet the age requirement, the organisers reserve the right to disqualify the participant from the competition.*
- Non-MOE-funded educational institutions will be required to pay a one-time registration fee of \$133. If the winning team comes from a non-MOE-funded educational institution, said institution will have to bear additional costs that cover travel vouchers to the World Finals. Failing which, the position for World Finals goes to the runner-up.
- Each team can only have a maximum of **four** students from the same educational institution. The students in one team can be from different levels.
- Each team is allowed two reserves. Once the Singapore heats begin on 18 April 2017, no further substitution of reserves will be allowed in the competition. The four students that participate in the heats must be the same four students that participate in the semi-finals and national finals. Exceptions will only be granted for special cases. The organiser's decision is final.
- Each educational institution can send up to **two** teams.
- Students must provide a scanned copy of their ez-link cards/birth certificates/passports during registration.
 - If a participant fails to submit the document, the organisers reserve the right to disqualify the participant from the competition.*
- The registration deadline is **17 February 2017**.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- All participants must be NLB members.
- All educational institutions must sign up for a DIY READ account. This is to facilitate the provision of reading materials that will help your students prepare for the competition.
- Students are not allowed to use any books, reference materials or mobile devices in the Quiz arena. Mobile devices must be kept in the students' bags.
- The event will be filmed and made available as publicity material to promote and raise awareness of Kids' Lit Quiz™. Photographs will also be taken and there might be media present to interview students.
- All participants are eligible to participate in the Literary Boot Camp on 14 March 2017. More details about the camp will be released at a later date. Participation in the camp is on a first-come, first-served basis.

POSB-NLB Kids' Lit Quiz™ Singapore Heats

- The heats will be held on 18-19 April 2017.
- Teams have to answer 100 questions categorised into ten themes. Each question will only be asked twice by the Quizmaster and answers have to be written on the paper provided. Participating teams have to answer all questions within the time limit of each round. *(Teams are allowed to guess an answer).* After each round, the answers will be collected and marked by the judges.

- The top fifteen teams from each day of the heats will qualify for the semi-finals. The semi-finals will be held on 20 April 2017.
- Teams have to answer 100 questions categorised into ten themes. Each question will only be asked twice by the Quizmaster and answers have to be written on the paper provided. Participating teams have to answer all questions within the time limit of each round. *(Teams are allowed to guess an answer).* After each round, the answers will be collected and marked by the judges.

- The scoring system is as follows:

POSB-NLB Kids' Lit Quiz™ Singapore Finals

- The top ten teams from the semi-finals will qualify for the national finals. The finals will be held on 22 April 2017, from 10.00am-1.00pm.
- Teams have to answer 65 questions categorised into five themes. The Quizmaster will read out each question. The first team to press the buzzer will get to answer the question. If they answer correctly, the team will be awarded with two points. However, if the team answers the question wrongly, the Quizmaster will open the question for the other teams to answer.

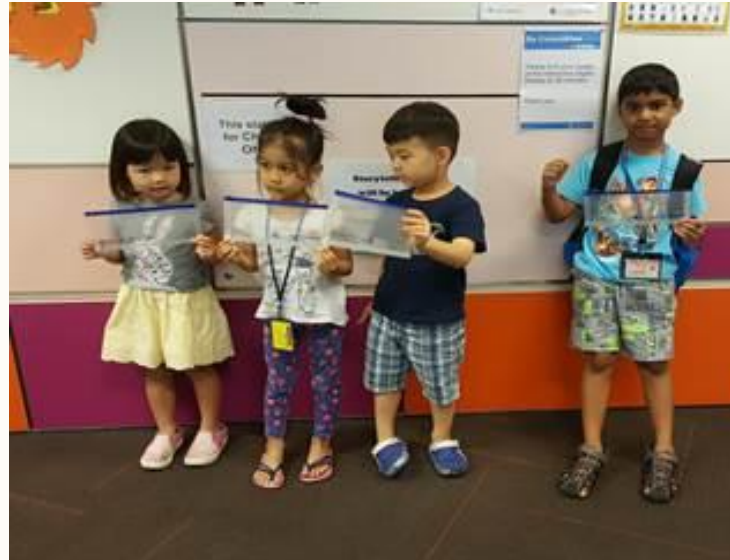


Competition

Communication Session

A briefing was conducted for teachers-in-charge on how best to prepare the students for the competition as well as the resources that they could tap on. The teachers found the session very useful as they were given insights into the how the competition will be like.

Local Variations

Involving the masses

- Marj Brown, the creator of the quiz conceptualized Phendulani to make books more available to students in South Africa.
- 90% of the schools do not have functioning libraries and 13% of new state schools have libraries without any books.
- With Phendulani, under-resourced schools are twinned with Kids' Lit Quiz (KLQ) schools that are often well-resourced.
- The KLQ schools will then reach out to Phendulani schools and help them prepare for the quiz – by giving out books from the lists, creating mock quizzes and even helping out with the book selection.
